We hope you have all enjoyed the holidays. We pray that each one of you have a blessed new year! The kids have been looking forward to getting back into our routine and we are sure that most of you are too! Now that we have covered the vowels & consonants, we will be learning to sound out words. Starting in January we will learn the long vowel sounds too.



Short (one) vowel rule: when there is one vowel in a word it usually has a short vowel sound.

Long (two) vowel rule: When there are two vowels in a word, the first vowel is a long sound and the second vowel is silent. Example: kit/kite

You can help your child by taking the time to sound out short and long vowel words at home. This will encourage your child to feel more confident as they sound out words with their peers. Remember to keep clothes updated for their clothes box. I will let you know when we will have the next "Good Behavior" activity. I am probably going to schedule in March, since we will have a Valentine's Party.
